## **NPCA Board of Directors Meets in Miami Beach**

The NPCA Board of Directors held its bi-annual meeting in Miami Beach from Thursday, January 29 to Sunday, February 1, 2004. Great Lakes Regional Representative Stephanie Arnold was in attendance. The full board met for one day-long and one half-day session and board subcommittees also met separately to discuss core topics of the NPCA.

A highlight of these meetings was a presentation by the new NPCA President, Kevin Quigley, outlining a strategic plan for the NPCA leading up to Peace Corps' 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2011. After six months on the job, a thorough assessment of the organization, and an extensive open dialogue with the RPCV community (24 affiliate group visits, 160 interviews, board meetings and staff retreats), Kevin and his staff unveiled a plan to leverage the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary to strengthen and refocus the NPCA. The major goals of the plan include working to engage and grow membership through significant, demonstrable advocacy on priority Peace Corps issues, strengthening links to serving volunteers and their families, enhancing opportunities for continued service at home and overseas, and leveraging Peace Corps insights to promote global understanding and tolerance. A number of specific action steps were addressed, which will improve communications between the NPCA, its individual members and affiliate groups and offer more opportunities to partner with and become engaged in the activities of the NPCA. This strategic plan, which was enthusiastically received by the NPCA Board of Directors will be implemented through a phased approach: 2004 representing a year of stabilization, 2005-2008 representing a period for growth, and 2009-2011 launching a plan for the future.

Another hot topic of discussion was a proposed downsizing and restructuring of the NPCA Board. In light of the recent trend of corporate and not-for-profit board downsizings, this concept was brought forward by a few NPCA members during the Presidents' Forum at the 2003 NPCA Conference in Portland, Oregon. After much debate, the Presidents' Forum voted in favor of the NPCA Board setting up a sub-committee to examine its current size and composition. The sub-committee of veteran and new board members was formed, worked diligently and presented its recommendations in Miami. After thorough discussion and consideration, the board approved the sub-committee's recommendation to reduce the size of the board from its current 30 members to a range of 15-21 members. It was further decided that, to help ensure that

the Board has the needed skill set to advance the NPCA, approximately half of the board should be elected and remainder appointed. Today 2/3 is elected and 1/3 appointed. The board also gave the Nominations and Elections Committee the mandate to continue to examine the committee structure and reduce the number of standing board committees to approximately five and define a list of program committees to advise the staff and the board. It is believed that a new leaner structure will make the role of the board primarily one of oversight, foster greater efficiency and reduce staff workload. A concern is that a smaller board will mean less membership representation. This topic will be discussed further at the Presidents' Forum to be held at the 2004 NPCA Conference in Chicago in August.

Stephanie updated the board on the status of the NPCA Conference planning efforts in Chicago. All are excited about the Chicago conference and highly impressed by the level of organization and hard work that has been demonstrated by the conference planning committee under the leadership of Trina Janes. Board members were asked to communicate with the geographic and country-of-service groups they represent to encourage them to register before the early-bird deadline of March 31<sup>st</sup> and to plan and communicate with the conference committee about their group activities during the conference. It was moved that the 2006 NPCA Conference be held in the Washington, D.C. area, as is customary for major anniversary conferences. The 2006 conference will coincide with the 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Peace Corps and will likely be hosted by the RPCVs of Washington, D.C. or the newly formed Baltimore group.

As if having our meeting in an auditorium located right on the beach in the heart of South Beach was not excitement enough, a number of fun activities were planned during the weekend. On Thursday evening, the board had the opportunity to attend a send-off reception for Peace Corps volunteers departing for service in the Caribbean. Peace Corps Director Gaddi Vasquez was present that evening and met with the board on two other occasions as well. On Friday evening, the RPCVs of South Florida hosted a dinner at a local restaurant, and on Saturday, University of Miami President, Donna Shalala, RPCV Iran and former Secretary of Health and Human Services during the Clinton administration, hosted a dinner at her home. In attendance were several NPCA Advisory Board members including two former Peace Corps Directors and former U.S. Senator Harris Wofford, an early architect of the Peace Corps, who helped Sargent Shriver plan and organize the agency during the Kennedy administration. Wofford later served as country director in Ethiopia and as an associate director of Peace Corps.

## Regional Organizer Wanted for RPCV Archival Project

Won't you join me in this wonderful, slightly quixotic, endeavor?

The RPCV archival project is seeking a regional organizer for the Chicago area. The Project works to recruit, train, and support volunteers from various NPCA Affiliates who conduct oral history interviews for the National Archives at the Kennedy Library. The Project has created an archival network through NPCA Geographic Area Affiliates but is at a stage in its development where additional organizers are urgently needed. For the past three years as Project Organizer, I have visited more than 25 Affiliates and recruited about 50 Project participants. My experience indicates that continued contact and mentoring is needed to firmly establish the Archival Project activity within an Affiliate, especially so in large, diverse groups like CAPCA and other nearby RPCV groups.

The main qualifications for a Regional Organizer are interest, time, curiosity, and a willingness to mentor volunteer participants (mostly RPCVs). No position within the Project is paid and there are some out-of-pocket expenses. As Regional Organizer you will be trained to conduct oral history interviews and to pre-screen personal papers for archival donation. You will also be oriented in the Project procedures (which, I like to think, are fairly simple). According to your own interest, you'll be able to do oral history interviews of RPCVs in your area.

The Project is operated in cooperation with the Archivists of the RPCV Collection at the John F. Kennedy Library in Boston. It is in the process of becoming a program of the National Peace Corps Association which will provide it with 501c3 status and the ability to pursue grants money. For the year 2004 the Project is still a bare-bones operation, although it has been and can be partly funded through local Affiliates (small grants from an Affiliate can cover some of the expenses of establishing the activity locally).
